

Ash has long been a sought after wood species for its hardness, durability, stability, and elasticity. It is often used for furniture, cabinetry, sports equipment and veneers. White ash in particular has a similar density to white oak and accepts stains evenly, making for superb flooring material. It is an excellent choice for various interior aesthetics, with a neutral brown color ranging from almost white to light brown and a distinct grain pattern.



Standard Dimensions

3.25" - 10" wide planks (*wider w/ special order*)

2' to 12' lengths

3/4" thick, tongue-and-groove

Tongue-and-groove and end-matched.

Grain

Mixed Flatsawn and Quartersawn.

Color

Ranges from a light brown to a slightly darker brown, generally consistent. Oil-based finishes produce yellow tones.

Character

Bug Tracks, otherwise clear.

Hardness & Stability

A hard and stable wood. 1,320lb_f on the Janka hardness scale. ~2.63 pounds per square foot.
