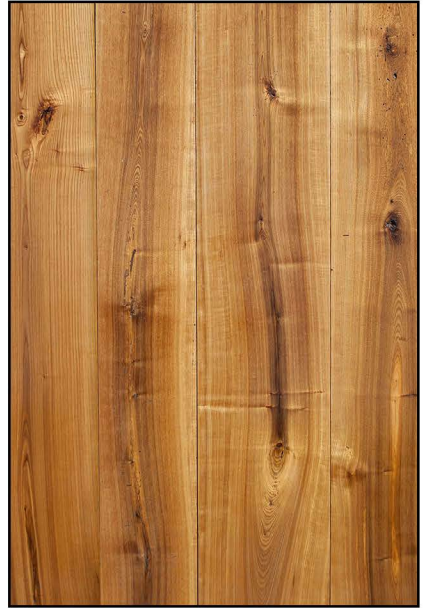


Reclaimed black ash flooring balances the best of consistency in pattern with old-growth character. Long, defined grain patterning and strong transitions into and out of knots make it a traditional wood of choice for flooring in distinguished homes.

Reclaimed from barns and other agricultural buildings throughout the Northeast, ash is a regional species with a long and storied history of use as baseball bats, basket weave, and tool handles. Looks especially beautiful with



## Standard Dimensions

2.5" - 8.5" wide planks (*wider w/ special order*)

2' to 12' lengths

3/4" thick, tongue-and-groove

Tongue-and-groove and end-matched.

## Grain

Straight, with typical old-growth irregularities. Mixed flat and quartersawn.

## Color

Ranges from a light brown to a slightly darker brown, generally consistent. Oil-based finishes produce yellow tones.

## Character

Knots, checking, wormwood, and occasional nail holes and accompanying mineral stains are present and desirable.

## Hardness & Stability

A hard and stable wood. 850lb<sub>f</sub> on the Janka hardness scale. ~2.14 pounds per square foot.



## Certifications

Qualifies for LEED MRc3, Materials Reuse credit. May qualify for LEED MRc5, Regional Materials credit.
