

Reclaimed Black Walnut



A traditional favorite of North American woodworkers and homeowners, black walnut's essential depth and richness of color have made it a desirable floor for generations. Reclaimed walnut combines outstanding color, tone, and depth with rustic salvage characteristics of knots and occasional nail holes.

Valued for strength, durability, beauty, and eminent workability, black walnut has historically been used in furniture, flooring, and gunstock applications. The heartwood is considered amongst the most beautiful material available to American woodworkers.

Standard Dimensions

2.5" to 12" wide planks (*wider w/ special order*)

2' to 12' lengths

3/4" thick, tongue-and-groove

Tongue-and-groove & end-matched.



Grain

Straight, with some irregularities and figure. Mixed flat and quartersawn. 95%-100% heartwood content.

Color

Ranges from a lighter pale brown to mostly dark chocolate brown with darker streaks. Color can sometimes have a grey, purple, or reddish cast. Sapwood, if present, is pale yellow-gray to nearly white.

Character

Knots, some checking, small nail holes, and slight mineral staining.

Hardness & Stability

A moderately hard and stable wood. 1,010lb_f on the Janka hardness scale. ~2.56 pounds per square foot.

Qualifies for LEED MRc3, Materials Reuse credit. May qualify for LEED MRc5, Regional Materials credit.
